A summary of recent transactions and personnel news within Greater Boston's real estate community.

- The team behind the South Boston Waterfront Sustainable Transportation Plan — which includes leadership from the Massachusetts Department of Transportation, the city of Boston, the Massachusetts Convention Center Authority, the Massachusetts Port Authority and A Better City — released its final recommendations Tuesday. The plan emphasizes improving access and mobility and supporting economic growth and vitality in the South Boston waterfront, which is set to add more than 17 million square feet in development, 9,200 residents and 22,900 jobs by 2035. Boston Mayor [Martin J. Walsh](#) called the plan "a blueprint for the future of an emerging Boston neighborhood." Read [the entire plan and its executive summary here](#).
- [Rosanne Foley](#) has been named executive director of the Boston Landmarks Commission. A longtime Dorchester resident, Foley will manage the city's historic preservation program, including the Boston Landmarks Commission and nine historic district commissions. She most recently served as executive director of Fields Corner Main Street and was previously cultural events and marketing consultant for Upham's Corner Main Street.
